In the Dunub campaign of 1809, he succeeded; but Austria's tenacious defence, the heroic efforts of the Tyroleans and the spasmodic efforts that premonitioned national growth in Germany showed that the whole aspect of the matter was changing, even in Central Europe, where rulers and peoples had so far been waxed under the impression of his will. For six months the siege continued with varying luck, but at last Ibrahim's courage and determination triumphed, and on September 9, after heroic resistance, Abdallah, with the remains of four hundred men, was forced to surrender. Heroic honors were first given to the founders of the colony or the city, as well as to the ancestors of families; if their name was not known, one was adopted from the legend. It is now, however, recognized that, whatever influence one may have from time to time carried on another, Teutonic myth and Teutonic heroic legends have been

developed on independent lines. As for the origin of the heroic sagas, as we now have them, Tacitus tells us that Arminius's deeds were still celebrated in the song a hundred years after his death (Annals, i, 88) and in Germany he speaks of old songs as the only kind of chronicle possessed by the ancient Germans; but, no matter how relics the old songs were laid in the Teutonic sagas, they left no recognizable mark on the heroic poetry of the German peoples. The Teutonic heroic saga, rightly so-called, consists of traditions related to the migration period, the earliest traces of which are in the works of historical writers such as Ammian Marcellin and Cassiodor. The Celtic heroic saga in the British Isles can be divided into two main Groups gaelic (Irish) and Brython (Wales), the first, with the exception of the purely mythological, in Ultonian (associated with Ulster) and The Aussie. Ultonians grouped around the names of King Conchobar and hero Cuchullin, the Irish Achilles, Ulster's defender against the whole of Ireland, is regarded by some as a sunny hero. The main remains of the Spanish heroic epic are some poems about Sid, about seven babies Lara and about Fernand Gonzalez, Count of Castile. The Slavic heroic saga of Russia is centered around Vladimir Kievsky (980-1015), the first Christian ruler of this country, whose identity was eclipsed by the personality of Ilya (Elias) Muromsky, the son of a peasant who is said to have saved the empire from the Tatars at the urgent request of his emperor. Savonarola's party was apparently destroyed by his death, but when, in 1529-1530, Florence was subject to the horrors he had predicted, the most heroic defenders of his beloved, if ungrateful city, were The Pionori, who ruled his life with their commandments and revered his memory as Holy. French coursiers repeatedly beat on the flank of Rosenberg's forces, and long postponed the assault, and in the villages of Lannes with one division provided heroic and successful resistance, until the night the plaintiffs of the battle. This ability, combined with a willingness to sacrifice life at any moment on the altar of the country, feud or honor, made a wonderfully heroic character. However, despite this, his heroic attempt to synthesize all scientific knowledge could not help but fall in line with its purpose. One of the most influential things in his novels is the heroic permanence and loyalty of maid Amy to her exemplary mistress Roxanne. The cold cynicism with which he acted towards de Witt only corresponds to the heroic stubbornness with which he encountered Louis. Saint-Beuve in his Tableau 1828 sang Chenier's praise as the heroic forerunner of the romantic movement and predecessor of Victor Hugo. Fully trusted his sword, but the heroic struggle for life was barely enough to keep at bay numerous and powerful enemies with which Poland was envious. This strategic blunder was turned into the best advantage of La Valette, who so extended the most heroic defense. Then the 1st Guards Dragon (as known as the regiment of Queen Victoria), after a brilliant manoeuvre under heavy fire to get into the best position to deliver the charge, drove across the French line of pursuers from left to right, and with his heroic sacrifice freed the remnants of the infantry from further pursuit. Cautious historians viewed the so-called heroic age as a prehistoric period about which nothing definite was known or, in all likelihood, could be known. The disaster of the Republic prevented it from equipping more than 55 ships, but the patriotism of the race was warmed to white heat, and in De Ruyuter they possessed an admiral of unsurpassed skill and heroic character. We know from Einhard (Vita Karoli, cap. xxix.) that the Frankish heroic ballads were written on the orders of Charlemagne, and we can be sure that he himself was the subject of many similar things during his lifetime. This episode, which bears traces of folk heroic poetry, may well be the essence of the lost Carolingian cantilena.1. The legendary Charlemagne and his warriors were endowed with the great deeds of the earlier kings and heroes of the Frankish kingdom, for the romantics were not concerned with the considerations of chronology. But he accidentally found as his exhibitor a poet whose genius created a model for his successors, and definitely recorded a type of later heroic poems. Other early chansons referred to in Roland - Aspremont, enfans Ogier, Giteclin, Balan, associated with the wars of Charlemagne in Italy and Saxony - survived not in their original form, but only the first in early rollback. Sweden invaded Poland year, Tsarnetsky distinguished himself by his heroic defense of Krakow, which he surrendered only under the most Conditions. Tsarnetsky is considered one of the most famous of the heroic great captains of Poland, and he has the main dignity to pull her out of the difficulties that threatened to crush her during the disastrous reign of John Kazimir.
